Attendance Requirements



Leave of Absence

HPE emphasises the importance of attendance and punctuality, as we believe these elements are key to success.

STUDENTS MUST MAINTAIN AT LEAST 80% ATTENDANCE IN EACH COURSE

- In exceptional circumstances where students need to take a leave of absence for **20%** of scheduled classes/lectures, students should inform their course lecturers/coordinators and are required to obtain their prior approval by a formal email
- Students who are absent for **20%** of scheduled classes/lectures or more in a course without prior permission will be given a grade F (Fail) by their course lecturers. The grade F will be recorded on the students' transcript.

Fees (Section 3)

Section 3.1 Extension Fee

“If a student in a self-financed Master’s or Doctoral programme has to study beyond the normal study period (i.e., 1-year Full-time / 2-year Part-time), he/she has to pay for an **extension fee by semester (i.e., HK\$15,984/semester for 2025 intake students)**”



GAR HIGHLIGHTS



Course Enrollment (Section 4)

Section 4.1

“Students must ensure the completion of course registration before the course starts. Students who have not registered for any course in a semester (for full-time students) / two consecutive semesters (for part-time students) (excluding the summer semester) will be considered to have withdrawn from their programme at the University (as stipulated in 14.1) unless deferment of studies has been approved by the relevant Programme Leader/Coordinator.”

Section 4.4

“Students can add or drop a course during the add-drop period or before the third class meeting. Students are permitted to drop a course after the add-drop period but before the examination period or the deadline for submission of final assignments or presentation, whichever applicable, only for strong personal reasons, such as serious illnesses; the grade W (Withdrawn) will be recorded on the students’ transcript.”

Section 4.5

“Failure to attend a course does not automatically result in the course being dropped. Please refer to para 13.1 for the regulation on Leave of Absence.”

Course Assessments and Grades (Section 8)



Section 8.7 Repeating Courses

(8.7.1) “Students may be required by the Board of Examiners to repeat the failed courses or courses with a low grade (i.e. C- or D) to fulfil programme graduation requirements.”

Section 8.8 Academic Probation

(8.8.1) “**Students will be put on academic probation in the next semester when their Semester GPA is below 2.00.** They will not be allowed to take the study load beyond the maximum credit points (as specified by the programme) in the probation semester. Those who wish to take more credit points than what is stipulated in the programme should seek prior approval from their Programme Leader/Coordinator.”



GAR HIGHLIGHTS

Graduation Requirements (Section 10)

Section 10.1

“Students are responsible for the completion of all the graduation requirements of the programme in which they are officially enrolled.

To graduate, students must:

- Achieve the **minimum number of credit points** required by the programme and satisfy all other stipulated programme requirements such as Field Experience, language exit requirements, and Dissertation / Thesis / Research Project (if applicable);
- **Obtain a Programme GPA of 2.00 or above**; and
- Complete the requirements as prescribed by the programme.”



GAR HIGHLIGHTS



Academic Honesty (Section 18)

Section 18.1

Students are required to carry out all academic activities honestly and in good faith. Any act that contravenes standards of academic honesty such as plagiarism, impersonation, cheating in examinations and collusion is strictly prohibited by the University.



Academic Honesty in Submission of Coursework

→ AI-enabled Generative Tools

Policy on Academic Honesty, Responsibility and Integrity (Aug 2023)

(Section 5.1) Plagiarism

Plagiarism is defined as copying another person's phrasing or borrowing their idea, concept or argument without appropriate acknowledgement. **Copying from AI-generated contents without proper declaration is also regarded as plagiarism.**

(Section 5.7) Use of AI-Enabled Generative Tools without Proper Declaration

Students who use AI-Enabled Generative tools in the preparation of an assessment task **must declare their use of such tools** and **take full responsibility for the content submitted for assessment**. The acceptable use of AI varies across disciplines, subjects, and assessment tasks. Course teacher will provide this information. But it is students' responsibility to check the assessment guidelines and relevant policies, and to understand what is expected of students.

- After the declaration period, any alteration to the change of students' chosen GD or late application will **NOT** be allowed
- Request for early collection of the certificate is **NOT** allowed

Important Notes for Students from Mainland China on Overseas Credential Evaluation

- Students who have fulfilled the programme requirements will be conferred the degree upon the approval of the University's Academic Board. The University bears no responsibility for the evaluation of its degrees outside of Hong Kong. Students are advised to consult with the relevant authority(ies) for the prevailing rules/regulations.
- Individuals who would seek qualification certification in Mainland China after graduation should contact the Chinese Service Centre for Scholarly Exchange (CSCSE) 中國(教育部) 留學服務中心 (<https://www.cscse.edu.cn>) for updated details.
- The certification in Mainland China is an independent process from the conferral of academic qualification in Hong Kong by the University. For the avoidance of doubt, no warranties are given in respect of individual graduate's qualification certification or recognition in Mainland China or any other professional qualification or license outside Hong Kong.
- **CSCSE takes a very prudent approach in evaluating each application, including the students' residential period in Hong Kong during the entire study period. When evaluating graduates' credentials, the full border entry and exit records of individual applicants will be examined.**
- **Students who would pursue credential recognition should be aware that short stays in Hong Kong during the study period may not fulfil the CSCSE residential requirements, leading to possible uncertainty and risks to their credential recognition.**
- **Students are seriously advised to consider the above when making personal plans, such as accommodation and travel plans from Hong Kong, etc. and make necessary arrangements where appropriate.**
